## AYSO Soccer 101

### Parent Player Guidelines 2007-2008

AYSO Region 104 is a member of the American Youth Soccer Organization. The headquarters of AYSO is in California, where the program started in 1964. AYSO is a not for profit corporation. AYSO Region 104 is an **All Volunteer** organization. AYSO Region 104's purpose is to provide a happy, healthy and fun environment in which to play soccer; where playing and participating are the most important ingredients to having fun, not the results of the game.

### UNDERSTANDING AGE GROUPS

Youth players are grouped into divisions based on their age as of July 31 of the year the season starts. On the bottom line of the "At A Glance" section on page 3, you will find a range of birth dates which define the age groups. Nationally, AYSO uses two year age groups. Because of the size of our region, we use one year age groups for all divisions except U14 and U19. The "At A Glance" also gives you information about your players division. For example, a player born on June 1, 1998 will be 10 years old as of August 1, 2008, and would be referred to as "Under 11" or a "U11" player. Please determine your child's age group. This will be useful to you later when you look at the game schedules or need other age group information.

We have some exceptions; when we don't have enough players to form a reasonable number of teams in a group, we will consider expanding the age group to include more birth dates. Also, our minimum age requirement is 4 1/2 as of August 1, 2003. For this group, U5, we use September 1st, not August 1st as the cut off date.

### SOCCER ETIQUETTE

**Know your child's team number.** All AYSO information and data is maintained using the **TEAM NUMBER**. Cheer positively for the things you like and encourage your team. Have fun. Learn the names of all the children

on your team. Never criticize the other team, or any of your child's teammates. The size of the field and the continuous nature of the game diminish the effectiveness of sideline coaching. Often in our enthusiasm as spectators, we may yell instruction to the players, but please leave all coaching to the coach.

The referees are all volunteers. While their decisions may not be agreeable to all, their decisions are final. Dissent or derogatory remarks will not be tolerated. Such action could be cause for termination of the game. The referee can caution players and coaches, eject players and coaches, or terminate the game if it becomes necessary.

All spectators are required to stand at least 1 yard from behind the sideline and must stay between the penalty areas. Coaches and referees are asked to enforce this rule.

The Home Team and their spectators take the North or East side of the field, provides the game ball, and puts up or takes down the nets if they are the first or last game of the day.

The Visiting Team and spectators take the South or West side of the field, check the field for trash and hazards before the game, and pick up trash after the games.

The Albuquerque Parks and Recreation Department and the Albuquerque Public Schools permit us to use their fields. It is our duty to use these facilities responsibly and to keep the fields clean. It is illegal to bring any glass container onto city parks or to consume alcoholic beverages. Animals must be leashed. **Smoking is prohibited** at any AYSO activity and on any Albuquerque Public Schools field.

### PLAYER ELIGIBILITY

AYSO Region 104 is open to boys and girls ages 4 to 18. All divisions are grouped by age as of August 1 of the year of registration.

### REGISTRATION

Registration is held in April for the season starting the following August. This informa-

tion is published in the Goalmouth and posted to the AYSO web site at [www.ayso104.org](http://www.ayso104.org). Waiting lists for space available placements are maintained throughout the year.

### **REFUND POLICY**

All refund requests must be made in writing. No voice mail or fax requests can be accepted. Requests received by June 30, 2008, will receive a full refund. Requests received July 1 through the day before the first game of the fall season will receive a 50% refund. No refunds will be issued after the first game of the season. ### **TEAM SELECTION AND NOTIFICATION**

After the spring registrations teams are formed by computer within geographical areas of the city. Teams are reformed each year. Coaches will contact their players 1-2 weeks before the start of practice, or before the first game for U5 and U6.

### **CHANGING TEAMS**

If a player has a particular need that must be addressed in team selection, the parents may either mail their request to AYSO or email it to [move.committee@ayso104.org](mailto:move.committee@ayso104.org). Players may be moved to accommodate specific physical needs or to remedy coach/player conflicts. Players are not moved to accommodate carpooling, to be with best friends, or because of coach/parent conflicts. Players may only play on one AYSO regular season team.

Mail all requests for placement or move to the Move Committee, P.O. Box 3561, Albuquerque, NM 87190. Be sure to include your name, address, and phone numbers, your players full name and birth date, and the reason for your request.

### **UNIFORMS & EQUIPMENT**

AYSO will provide a numbered jersey, socks and shorts that the players are to keep. Players provide their own shin guards and soccer shoes. Players should bring his/her own water bottle to all practices and games. "Bike" or "slider" shorts of the same color as the uniform shorts may be worn under the uniform shorts provided they are no longer than the uniform shorts. Shin guards are mandatory at all games and practices. Keepers may wear soft kneepads and/or elbow pads.

Players may not wear any jewelry, casts, splints or any other such objects which might be dangerous to them or another player during practice or games. Players may not wear caps without the express permission of the referee. Long hair should be tied up with a soft band.

Knee braces are allowed provided, that in the judgment of the assigned referee, the brace is adequately covered and padded to eliminate the possibility of its causing injury to

other players.

### **PARENTS' MEETINGS**

After team assignments in early August, each coach will hold a parents' meeting. The purpose of this meeting is for parents to meet the coach, identify key team volunteers, set the practice schedule, discuss AYSO philosophy and parent guidelines, complete required paperwork, and to answer questions. Each team should have a Team Parent, Assistant Coach, Referee, and Assistant Referee. AYSO provides training clinics and certification for these volunteer positions. Coaches are to submit the names of these volunteers to their Division Commissioner prior to the first game of the season.

### **A WORD FOR PARENTS**

It cannot be over-emphasized that **AYSO is for the players**. Our emphasis is placed on good sportsmanship by demonstrating fairness and self-control, and by having a good time. Parents, coaches and officials are role models for their children; thus, everyone's encouragement and support of the players is expected. Regardless of your child's age, it's important that you attend the games. While participation in a competitive situation is an important aspect of the game, it is not to be confused with a "win-at-all-costs" attitude. The soccer promoted by AYSO is a balance of fun, development and competition.

Soccer is fast, spirited, and continuous. One of its charms is its ad-lib quality - much of the action is made up as the game progresses. All of this can, and often does set the stage for some spectator situations that are not consistent with what AYSO is trying to do for our players. We, the parents, spectators, coaches and referees have a responsibility to keep our program fun for all. Please take a few moments to review the guidelines on the following pages.

### **PRACTICE AND GAMES**

When players are registered and placed on a team, it is understood that they will come regularly and on time for practice, and that they will cooperate with the coach in building a team for everyone's enjoyment. It is important that the players attend practices because that is where game skills and strategy are taught. Coaches should be notified if it is necessary for a player to miss practice. The authorized number and length of practices are shown on page 3, in the "At A Glance" section.

Team practices are scheduled at local parks and public schools as close as possible to your neighborhood. As the players grow older, they may have to travel further to their practice fields. Please see that players have made arrangements to get home safely after practices and games. This is not the coach's responsibility.

Our season is comprised of two sessions, Fall and Spring. Fall session games begin in September and run 8 weeks, with practice usually starting in August for U7 and older. The same teams resume in March for 8 more games. We conclude the Spring session with end-of-season play offs for divisions U11 and older.

On game days, all players who arrive before the end of the first quarter and are in proper uniform will play at least one half of the game.

- 1) U14 may play sixths or eighths instead of quarters as determined by the DC's prior to the start of the season.
- 2) U19 plays with free substitution.
- 3) 35 minutes before each game is practice time. Coaches have prepared activities in skill development. Do not skip this practice time.
- 4) Roster Limit may be exceeded if requested by the coach and approved by the board as long as minimum playing times are met.
- 5) Children with August birthdays may play in the next older division to be with classmates. Playing down a level is never permitted.

## PRACTICE FIELDS

Practices on city parks will be restricted to assigned fields. Assigned practice fields will be as close as possible to each players' neighborhood dependent on the number of players in the neighborhood.

All coaches assigned to a field must coordinate through their park monitor the night of the week each will practice. We share practice fields with teams from other organizations. We must cooperate with all teams and share the fields equitably. If conflicts arise please bring them to the attention of the Field Scheduler.

Practice in front of the goal area is PROHIBITED! Most damage to the fields occurs in the mouth of the goal. Coaches should use cones or flags to identify goals away from the goal posts. If we abuse the fields, the city may prohibit us from using them, a decision that could result in our limiting or decreasing the opportunities for children to play in AYSO.

### REMEMBER:

Please be courteous to those who live near our practice and game fields. Arrange your practices so that balls will not be kicked onto private property. Bring your own water. Do not use water on private property. Do not ask to use their bathrooms. Make bathroom stops before arriving at the field. Never block driveways. Park legally on the park or field side of the street when possible.

### WEATHER

Soccer is generally played "rain or shine". However, because of the shortage of practice and game fields in Albuquerque, we must be extra cautious to prevent damage to the fields. Our fields are easily damaged when they are saturated. Therefore the AYSO Board has adopted the following guidelines:

1. **RAIN CANCELLATIONS.** In the case of a "general" rain over most of Albuquerque, all practices and games will be canceled. The Safety Director will make the decision to cancel. In his/her absence, the Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner will decide. Notice of game cancellation will be posted on the AYSO Web Site ([www.aysol04.org](http://www.aysol04.org)) and coaches and RC's can call the AYSO information line 342-2976 for immediate updates. In addition, radio and TV will be used when possible for secondary notification.

**Any field which is saturated, for any reason, and vulnerable to turf damage shall have its' games or practices cancelled.** We should "over cancel" rather than risk damage to the parks. The decision to play or practice will be made as follows:

**a. Games:** The assigned Referee is the only person authorized to cancel a game. Once a game has been canceled, subsequent games on that field are also canceled. The referee will make sure that the goal nets are removed. Teams may not play games on fields without nets. Upon cancellation, all coaches and referees scheduled for that field should be notified of the can-

cellation by the Division Commissioner and the Referee Scheduler, respectively.

**b. Practices:** Coaches will decide on cancellation and will always act to prevent injury to players and turf damage to the fields.

2. **Lightening:** AYSO does not practice or play when lightning is present. Coaches and Referees may choose to wait out a storm, provided that sufficient shelter is available for all players. Coaches should also exercise extreme caution in case of thunderstorms. Two of the most dangerous places to be during a thunderstorm at a park are in the middle of an open field or under a tree.

## OFFICIATING

Referees shall at all times enforce the rules of competition as defined by the FIFA Laws of the Game and modified by AYSO. Referees shall at all times place the most emphasis on the welfare of the players and officiate the game in a manner encouraging clean competition and good sportsmanship. If a player falls or appears to be injured, the referee, at his/her discretion, may stop play to ensure the welfare of the player even if the ball has not gone out of play.

## FIELD SAFETY AND INJURIES

Soccer is generally considered a safe sport. However, youngsters participating in any athletic activity may suffer an injury. If a player is injured in practice or during a game, the Safety Director should be notified as soon as possible. If a player appears to be injured it is the Referees decision to stop, or not stop, the game and to determine if assistance is needed from the coaches. Younger players frequently trip and fall down, so please do not get upset if the referee does not stop the game every time a player is down on the field.

Remember no one is allowed onto the field without the permission of the referee - that includes parents. Most times, fallen players get back up and resume playing.

## SOCCER ACCIDENT INSURANCE (SAI)

All AYSO registered players, coaches and referees are covered for accidental injury. Please read and keep the SAI brochure. To be covered the injury must be caused by a covered accident that occurs when under adult supervision and while:

1. Participating in scheduled games, tournaments or practice sessions; or
2. Traveling under adult supervision to or from scheduled games, tournaments, or practice sessions.

All accidents should be reported to the Safety Director at 342-2976, ext. 329, whether or not a claim is filed with AYSO.

## SPECIAL AYSO PROGRAMS

**VIP - Our Very Important Player** program is designed so players ages 5 to 95 with physical, mental, or developmental challenges can experience organized soccer. Participants are placed on teams based on their size and ability. "Buddies" are encouraged to assist players on the field. All games are played on Sundays.

**ACT and Select Teams** - AYSO Region 104 sponsors **select teams** to represent our region in tournaments and to play in the

“club” league. These teams may participate in fund raising activities and receive corporate sponsorships. All team members are expected to participate in these activities. Traveling may occur between seasons and during the summer.

1. **Advanced Competition Teams (ACT)** , U9 through U19, are teams, comprised of regular season team players, formed to play in tournaments. ACT activities may not interfere with regular season play and ACT Players must attend at least 70% of their regular season practices and games. ACT players may not play for a soccer league other than AYSO Region 104 and must tryout to be considered.
2. **Select Teams** are regular season teams, U11 and above, that play in the Duke City League against “club” teams. Tryouts are in May for the following season. AYSO rules and philosophy apply to Select Teams.

**PICTURES & TROPHIES**

Pictures and trophy sales are fundraisers for the ACT and Select teams and both take place during the Spring season although pictures are also taken during the Fall season..

**REFEREE DISPUTES**

If you feel a referee has not properly enforced the laws of the game at a match you have observed, please do not confront the referee at the field. Instead, call 342-AYSO, extension 326 and describe your concern, giving the referee's name, the park and date and time the match was played. The referee staff will review the concern and take appropriate action. Our goal is to improve the program through education, not to place blame. We use this type of situation as an opportunity to help our referees better understand the game.

**DISPUTE RESOLUTION**

We recognize that not everyone will mesh perfectly. Disputes will occur and they need to be resolved as quickly and fairly

as possible. For coach-parent, coach-player, and player-player problems, the following protocol should be used:

1. Discuss problem with coach
2. Discuss problem with Division Commissioner.
3. Discuss problem with Boys or Girls coordinator (as appropriate) or the Chief Referee or Coach.
4. Write a letter to Board of Directors

Once a formal, written request is received, it will be reviewed and appropriate action will be taken.

Issues of Child or Volunteer Safety and Protection should be brought to the immediate attention of the Child and Volunteer Protection Advocate at 342-2976 ext. 374.

Flagrant or continued disregard for AYSO's philosophy or rules by players, volunteers, or parents may result in an A&D Hearing. An A&D hearing may result in exoneration, counseling, discipline and/or dismissal from the AYSO program. Specific guidelines for dispute resolution are contained in AYSO Region 104's Standing Rules and may be obtained upon request.

**FORMATION OF TEAMS**

We form new teams every year in an attempt to balance the competition within age groups. Our focus is on the individual development of each child, not on the creation of "winning teams".

Each coach, whether new or returning, starts with a new team every fall. Typically, each team will have some children who have played together before, but there will also be new children as well. This benefits the children because each team starts fresh every year, leading to more balanced teams (no dynasties). Players also get to make new friends and get to know other friends better. The coaches must focus on developing the individual skills of each player, not simply working on improving an existing team's performance. This creates an environment in which players can learn about soccer, make new friends, have fun, and be a part of the local soccer community.

## **Soccer for Players with Special Needs** **The Albuquerque AYSO "VIP" Program**

**The VIP program is a unique division of AYSO for challenged players with physical, mental, or developmental limitations**

- VIP teams are composed only of players with special needs
- No experience necessary. Players must be 5 years old by July 31. We have VIP teams for all ages, with no upper age limit.
- No geographic residency requirements. Practices and games are held in Montgomery Park on Comanche east of San Mateo
- No player is turned away.
- Registration includes a complete uniform and a ball. The only equipment you need to provide is shin guards, shoes, and a smile!

### **Program Objectives and Style of Play**

The AYSO VIP Program provides a quality soccer experience for children and adults aged 5 and up; the program is open to *anyone* who's physical or developmental challenges make it difficult to successfully participate on a main-stream team. VIP teams may include those who have:

- Impaired vision, hearing, or mobility
- Autism, Down syndrome, mental retardation, or developmental delays
- Cerebral palsy, muscular dystrophy, and other physical handicaps
- Attention Deficit Disorder or related attention/focus challenges

These individuals are Very Important Players (VIP) in AYSO. We recognize that everyone needs to feel a sense of belonging and acceptance. The VIP program offers that acceptance and carries AYSO's philosophy of Everyone Plays® to new heights - giving everyone a chance to play. Our goals for every participating player are:

- Have fun playing soccer
- Understand the fundamentals of the game
- Learn teamwork and fair play
- Increase positive self-esteem
- Become more physically fit
- Meet and be comfortable with new people



### **Buddies**

People with disabilities are members of our community: the children of friends, neighbors, relatives; our classmates and coworkers. Kids with special needs are estimated to make up approximately 10% of the school-age population. Special schools and classrooms can isolate these children, so the AYSO VIP program has been structured to integrate our special players into the rest of AYSO by having non-disabled players - "buddies" - assist them on the field. These relationships frequently grow beyond support into meaningful friendships.

VIP helps more than just the players. Buddies and other volunteers increase their appreciation and understanding of individuals with special needs. They find their lives greatly enriched by their involvement with their new VIP friends. For parents thinking they would never see their children playing a sport or making new friends, VIP gives them joy and hope.
